SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Eastern Technical High serves students primarily from the Essex, Middle River, Rosedale, Bowleys Quarters, Parkville, Perry Hall, White Marsh, and Kingsville communities of Baltimore County.

With a current enrollment of 1255, Eastern Tech offers a comprehensive academic and technical education to students who successfully complete eighth grade and fulfill its highly competitive application process. Advanced Placement, Gifted and Talented, and Honors level courses are available for qualified students in these areas: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and Computer Technology. Ten Career Majors are offered which emphasize state-of-the-art technology. Eastern Tech currently has twelve computer labs for student use, all with Internet connections.
